

## UPDATED DISPLAY AT THE MISSION LOG CHURCH

The replica of the Mission Log Church was built in 1939 by the Old Mission Betterment Association to celebrate the one-hundredth anniversary of Rev. Peter Dougherty's Presbyterian mission on the peninsula. Post celebration the church was to be turned into a museum displaying the wonders of the peninsula. It took approximately thirty-five years before a display was artfully accomplished by the Old Mission Women's Club. Fifty years has passed, our need for a museum representing the entire peninsula is no longer relevant, and our cultural and historic outlook has been redefined. It was time for a facelift.

A team of five from the Old Mission Peninsula Historical Society took on the challenge to create the updated display. After two years of work the display has been completed and installed. Come learn about the creation of the peninsula, the people Rev. Dougherty met and worked with the Anishinaabe. Read about the political and religious culture of the times that Rev. Dougherty was living in. How Reverend Dougherty, with the help of Chief Agosa established the mission and why the mission moved to Omena. Explore what happened after the move and the creation of the replica.
